Quote from the Playwright:

Being from Philadelphia and living in a neighborhood that is currently being gentrified, I felt a duty to give voice to my community. Whenever I go back home to visit, I realized that the community I grew up in is quickly leaving, and what is so fascinating to me is that the Bodegas and Chinese Take-Outs are not. Stores like Master Wok were here before I was born and will probably remain after my new neighborhood is complete. Being here in San Francisco is really ironic because it feels like a living cautionary tale of gentrification.

The leading question of *SALT PEPPER KETCHUP* is "**How would immigrant business owners in the hood react if the threat of gentrification walked into their store?**"

Playwright Bio: Josh Wilder is a playwright from Philadelphia, PA. His work has been developed at The Fire This Time Festival, Playwrights' Center, Pillsbury House+Theater, The History Theatre, New York Theatre Workshop, The Drama League, Company One, Oregon

Shakespeare Festival and The O'Neill National Playwrights Conference. He is a former Jerome Fellow and Many Voices Fellow at The Playwrights' Center and has been in residence at The Royal Court Theatre. Josh is a MFA candidate in Playwriting at Yale School of Drama.
